

1 Q. And where did you say that these -- well, strike that,
2 please, and let me move on to another topic.

3 Let's talk now about how your company got its name. Isn't
4 it true that -- well, strike that, too. We don't really care
5 about the name now, do we?

6 When did you come to this country?

7 A. I came from France in 2002, sir.

8 Oh, and by the way, can I amplify on something you asked
9 me about earlier?

10 Q. No. If your counsel wants clarification, he'll have his
11 chance later, when it's his turn to question you.

12 In 2002, when you arrived here, did you -- where did you
13 land at? I assume you came by air, right?

14 A. No, I came by boat.

15 Q. By boat? How interesting. I didn't think people did that
16 anymore. I certainly wouldn't, not after seeing "Titanic."

17 Well, anyway, what city did you come to?

18 A. New York.

19 Q. What part of New York?

20 A. Brooklyn.

21 Q. And why did you -- strike that.

22 Let me ask you this. What year did you start your
23 company?

24 A. Do you mean officially?

25 Q. Yes.

Simple, straightforward questions or answers wrap back to the LEFT MARGIN, regardless of how long they may be — unless there are major shifts in thought / subject / topic, such as require new paragraphs to aid the reader.

When a new paragraph is needed within a question or an answer, begin it at the FIRST TAB, as illustrated at lines 3, 6, 8, 12, 17, and 22.
